## LETTER FROM FATHER ANDY

I wonder do you have a favourite Easter hymn? Maybe, *When I Survey the Wondrous Cross*, or *There is a Green Hill Far Away*, or *Jesus Christ is Risen Today*! or *Thine Be The Glory*. Those are just a few that spring to mind as I write this letter and of course there are quite a few more that you might chose. Most of these are what I would consider to be fairly traditional Easter and Passiontide hymns. There are of course more modern ones written by some of the more contemporary hymn and worship song writers.

One of my favourites, and as it happens one I have heard twice today (21st Feb), on both the radio and television, is *My Song is Love Unknown*.

My song is love unknown My Saviour's love for me. Love to the loveless shown, that they may lovely be.

For me, one of it's delights is that it reminds us, throughout, of God's love and friendship offered, given even during the events of Good Friday - the suffering of Christ's arrest, trial and execution - and of course it's invitation to us to reciprocate, to join in the worship of Jesus, whether that be at the foot of the cross, or on a sunny resurrection morn.

Here might I stay and sing No story, so divine Never was love dear friend, Never was grief like thine. This is my friend, In whose sweet praise I all my days could gladly spend.

I trust I am not the only one to appreciate this wonderful hymn, and we do seem to sing it a to during our services in Holy Week. Again, for me, it falls into the classification of a traditional Passiontide hymn.

I wonder though whether you have ever stopped to really reflect on those opening words: 'Love to the loveless shown that they may lovely be.'

These words are a reminder to us that Easter is fundamentally a season of change. Death is changed to new life, resurrected life. Love is given, that the loveless may be changed, transformed. That the loveless may become lovely. Sin is conquered by grace: by the freewill offering of Christ crucified, risen and glorified.

Easter is also the season of Hope. Because of Christ's victory over death, we can have hope, and faith in His promises. Hope and faith in his promises of new life, eternal life, life in relationship with Him and our heavenly Father.

This year, more than most, the Gornal and Sedgley team faces change. God willing, the recruitment process for the new Team Rector will move past the shortlisting stage in Holy week itself. Towards the end of the Easter season, Chris and James and I will take our leave of the parish, and make way for the new life that God is I pray already preparing to bring to Gornal and Sedgley. New life - Resurrection life.

What part I wonder will you play in the new life God offers this Easter time? Will you embrace it and nurture it, or will you try and stifle and quench it? It is a gift of grace. A gift freely offered. A gift for us to accept or not as we so choose. How will you choose?

Wishing you all a joyful and blessed Eastertide.

### LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

Palm Sunday is the first day of Holy Week, in which Christian tradition marks the last week of Jesus' earthly life. It starts off with Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey to be greeted by a happy crowd waving palm branches in celebration. In the space of a few days shouts of victory gave way to betrayals, from celebration to crucifixion.

Strange to say, Holy Week with its moments of violence and ruthless politics we must also remember that Jesus comes as a Light to the world. He comes into our lives when things suddenly go wrong, when we seem to lose reality, when we yearn for a world in which respect and kindness dominate.

Jesus is tried on trumped up charges, found guilty by a corrupt political system and put to death because he challenges the powers that be.

But before all this we have the meeting in the upper room where Jesus washes the disciples feet on the night Judas betrayed him. In that upper room Jesus shares with his disciples the bread and the wine saying " Do this in remembrance of me " as we do Sunday by Sunday.

Then on Good Friday the day that Jesus was crucified, a day of great solemnity which is disciples could not join in. Mary Magdalene and Mary his mother stand at the foot of the cross. This may call us to being present with and one another in those dreadful moments of suffering and death.

Then comes the glorious Easter Day when the women went to the tomb to find the stone rolled away and the tomb was empty. I wonder what went through their minds? The stone has been moved what in our own lives is beyond our capability to move or roll the stone away? What is beyond our strength despite our desire and hope? The resurrection begins with an expected change of circumstances, a change we did not anticipate and certainly not create.

The Life of the infinite God makes a quantum leap and the stone of life is rolled away. It may be that we know it when we are amazed when we find the tomb empty when we least expect it.

## AN APPRECIATION OF ALL SAINTS' SOCIAL CLUB

All Saints' Social Club formally closed on December 31st 2015. It is a pity, therefore that this appreciation of the contribution of the Club to All Saints' Church over the last 34 years should also be effectively an obituary. The closure notices in the Church Magazine and Pew Sheet were short and to the point so it seems only right and proper that the Club should have a fuller final tribute. As a former Chairman and a member since 1984 I felt a duty to provide this.

The Club commenced operations in 1981 in what had been a meeting room at the back of the Church Hall, originally opening six nights a week. The premises were appropriately refurbished including an elegant bar that put to shame the equivalent in many local licenced premises.

The remit of the Club was not only to serve the congregation of All Saints' but also local people who wished to participate. This policy ensured that many people were brought into a closer contact with our Church through the Club. The word local was, however, at times applied with some elasticity and names of visitors from Australia and the USA appear in the visitors' book.

Activities organised by or through the Social Club were much more varied than just regular evening opening including events such as quiz nights, concerts, meetings of the Church Men's Society and the Genealogy Society. In addition the Club room has been very popular as a comfortable place for meetings of the PCC/DCC, Scouts, Church Choir, Guild of Servers and other Church organisations.


The existence of the Social Club also increased the use of the Church Hall for events such as barn dances, skittles evenings, cheese and wine parties and jazz nights. The most prestigious event for many years was the annual All Saints' Day Parish Lunch where the quality of food served was at a standard that would not have shamed a hotel. In addition, for years, the New Year's Eve party was oversubscribed due to its quality and conviviality. Many Church members possibly do not realise just how much hard work went into these events and it is not fair to mention individual names since someone is inevitably omitted and possibly offended. There were of course groups of people that were the backbone of many operations of the Club, particularly the team who organised catering on many occasions, together with the loyal Bar Staff who regularly gave up two or more evenings a month to serve members. Making money was not the objective of All Saints' Social Club. However, well-ordered administration by Committee members and appointed Officers ensured that the Club regularly operated with a surplus of income over expenditure. This was achieved despite fees and bar prices always being kept well below commercial levels. A portion of this surplus was regularly reinvested in the Club premises to ensure that the quality gradually improved. In addition regular donations were made to the Al Saints' Church funds which over a period of 34 years amount to a very considerable sum.

The Club and the bar facility will be missed particularly as a support for so many functions. However, as the number of volunteer helpers decreased due to normal causes the work load became increasingly arduous for the remaining active members.

It has become fashionable at funerals to emphasise the positive attributes of the deceased person rather than the sorrow of the mourners. Let's do that with the Social Club – just be happy and thankful for what was done faithfully and selflessly by so many people over a very long period of time.

### CHOCOLATE & CHERRY LAMINGTONS RECIPE FROM JAN HUMPRIES

125g softened butter
125g caster sugar
2 medium eggs
125g S R Flour
25g Cocoa powder
200g cherries

- 1. Preheat oven gas 4 180°C grease a 20cm square cake tin & line with grease proof paper
- 2. Mix butter sugar, eggs & flour in a bowl. Mix cocoa powder with about 3tablespoons of cold water to a paste, then add to the bowl & mix until smooth & creamy
- 3. Fold in the cherries
- 4. Spoon into prepared tin & bake for 35mins or until risen & firm to the touch.
- 5. Leave in the tin for several hours to cool & firm up.
- 6. Remove the cake & with a sharp knife remove the crusty edges.
- 7. Spread 200g of black cherry preserve over the cake & sprinkle with desiccated coconut & cut into squares.
