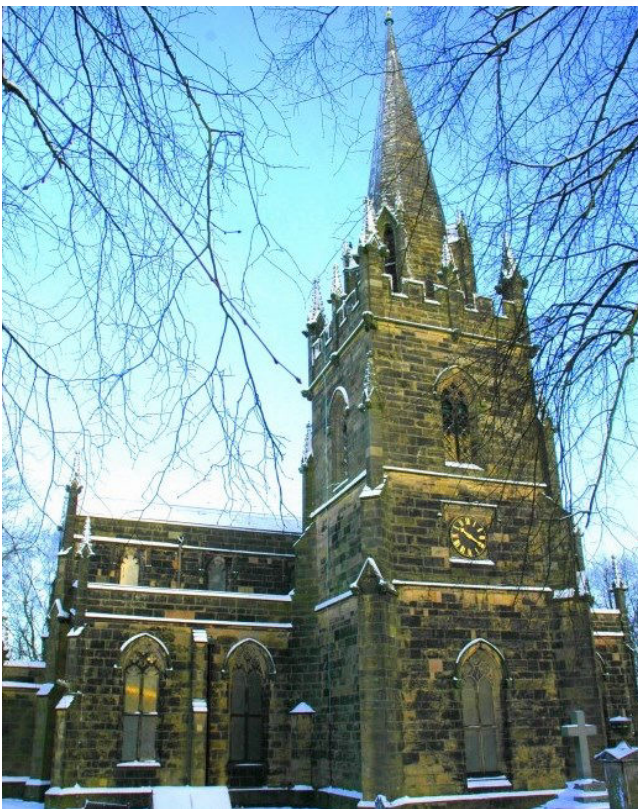

A LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

In the month of June, actually the 29th of June we celebrate the feast of St Peter. Our Lord Bishop John will be celebrating the Holy Eucharist at 7.30 pm.

Peter (then Simon) was a usual character, he was a fisherman along with his brother Andrew together with James and John left their boats to be become followers of Jesus. Jesus called them in Mathews and Marks gospels as "fishers of men"

During my training I once heard one of tutors call Peter "big mouth" because he was always putting his thoughts to others without thinking. In Mathews gospel Jesus asks "who do people say I am?" The Disciples give various answers. But when Jesus asks "who do you say I am?" Immediately Simon Peter answers "You are the Messiah the son of the Living God"

Jesus then declares; -

Blessed are you Simon son of Jonah, this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of heaven, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.

Some peoples view of Peter was an unlikely symbol of stability. When he was one of the first disciples called and was the spokesman for the group. Peter is also exemplar of "little faith" In Mathews Ch. 14 Peter will soon have Jesus say to him " O you of little faith why do you doubt" and he will eventually deny Jesus three times. Thus in the light of the Easter event, Peter becomes an exemplar of the forgiven sinner.

On the Easter Morning following the crucifixion of Jesus, the women's report of the empty tomb is dismissed by disciple's; but Peter and John run to the tomb finding it empty according to Luke's gospel. Peter then goes home without informing the other disciples.

In the final chapter of John's gospel Peter is in one of the resurrection appearances of Jesus, three times Peter affirmed his love for Jesus balancing the threefold denial. Then Jesus confirms the position of Peter as establishing by giving him jurisdiction over Christ Church.

Peter is also listed first among the Twelve Apostles in the gospels and in the Acts of the Apostles,

The Acts of the Apostles portrays Peter as an extremely important figure within the early church. Such as his sermon on the feast of Pentecost, conducting the election of Matthias and his opinion in the debate over converting Gentiles was crucial.

Various views have been expressed that Peter and Paul went on to be founders of the Church in Rome. Through the power of God wrought miracles and by turning many to the true religion built up the faithful and steadfast temple to the Lord.

When Jesus said to Peter that he would build his church upon the rock (Petra) that Peter (Petros) would establish the early church in Rome. This reminded me of a chorus from Sunday school days "build on the rock the rock that ever stands" We as Christians must continue today to build on the rock by proclaiming the "Good News" to all.

Song of the Somme

At 7.30 on the morning of 1st July 1916 thousands of British troops left the comparative safety of their trenches and advanced on the German lines.. An artillery onslaught of unprecedented ferocity had been laid on the German positions. So the British troops believed that there would be little or no opposition. They had been badly informed and before the day was out around 20,000 of them were dead and a further 40,000 injured. The battle raged on until winter weather brought it to a halt in November. By then the British and French had incurred 600,000 casualties

I visited the battlefield area about 20 years ago and saw an area of lovely farmland in brilliant sunshine. The land had healed but the tragedy that seared the minds of the British does so to this day. My thoughts are expressed below. Originally I envisaged a hymn fitting the tune 'Picardie' but the words are obviously not suitable for use in worship

*Rolling hills and fields filled with sunshine,
Woodlands, streams and flowers all around.
Fertile soils that nurtured God's produce,
food and fruit and bird's singing sound.
Picardy brought forth the joyful things of earth,
God's gifts, from the well nurtured ground.*

*Guns and bombs and young soldier's bodies
then became the Somme's summer's yield,
broken, limbless corpses in thousands
slaughtered men filled this harvest field.
Fear and hatred grew in stinking, putrid trench
man's worst nightmares - daily revealed.*

*Pointless slaughter of countless thousands,
Europe's brave young sons churned to mud.
Flowers of youth so mindlessly squandered
precious soil stained red with their blood.
Leaving broken hearted mothers, fathers, wives, grieving souls
with tears at the flood.*

*Many years have passed since the bloodbath
wounds to Somme's green pastures have healed.
Summer sun and frost of cold winters
have removed scars from the field.
But man still resists the healing hand of God
to the Prince of Peace fails to yield*

*Greater wars have come, bigger conflicts,
fiendish weapons have been released.
Lord, when shall we beat spears to ploughshares ?
Christ, when will this sinfulness cease ?
haste the promised time that war shall be no more,
Morning Star come down, bring us peace.*

WW1 TIMELINE - EVENTS OF 1916

June

1st Battle of Jutland ends.

2nd Battle of Mount Sorrel (Ypres) begins (ends 15).

4th Russian offensive begins (Brusilov's Offensive).

5th HMS Hampshire sunk by mine off Scottish coast. Field Marshall Kitchener & his staff drowned.

8th Bismarckburg (German East Africa) taken by British forces.

10th Compulsory Service Bill passed in New Zealand.

12th Kirman (Persia) occupied by British forces.

19th Handeni (German East Africa) occupied by British forces.

23rd Fort Thiaumont (Verdun) finally stormed by German forces (Bulk of position was captured on May 23rd & this date marks limit of German advance on Verdun).

27th Greek Government order general demobilisation.

30th Fort Thiaumont (Verdun) retaken by French forces.

The Battle of Verdun was continuing: ended 20/12/1916

1916 Olympics.

The 1916 Olympic Games were due to be held in Berlin but were cancelled. The 1920 games were held in Antwerp in honour of the suffering people of Belgium.

Brusilov Offensive.

General Alexei Brusilov, commander of the Russian forces in the south-west of the Eastern Front, formulated tactics that combined rapid movement with concentrated support fire allowing soldiers to advance quickly.

While the Brusilov Offensive was initially one of the war's most successful campaigns, it came at a heavy price: Central Powers lost 1.5 million men and the Russians half a million!

We were pleased to welcome Revd. Alma Organ, who led the communion service at our afternoon meeting in May. Alma then told us about her 'Pilgrimage to Iona'. This small island – Iona is approximately one mile wide and four miles long - in the Inner Hebrides, on the West Coast of Scotland, is a place of tranquility and natural beauty. Alma travelled from Oban to Mull and by ferry across the Sound of Iona to reach the island, where St Columba landed in 563. It is said that having been exiled from his native Ireland he journeyed, with his fellow monks, until he found a place to settle, where he could no longer see Ireland. They founded a monastery there. Today on Iona there is a school, Post Office, two hotels, the Bishop's House and the Abbey with its Celtic Cross standing in front of the Abbey. Alma went by boat to the neighboring island of Staffa, famous for Fingal's Cave, the dramatic feature which inspired the music of Mendelssohn. The pilgrimage had begun with the journey to this small island, far away from the busyness of town and city life, to a place of unspoilt natural beauty, a place of Celtic Christianity, a place ideally conducive to prayer, reflection and meditation.

Joan Sullivan shared her story of 'The World Peace Flame' with us at our evening meeting. In 1999 friends of Joan's at Dru Yoga Centre in North Wales were discussing world peace. They had worked in war zones, such as Bosnia, helping people heal emotional trauma and with the Millennium approaching wanted to take on a truly global initiative. One of the friends, called Mansukh, told them about when he lived in Kenya and his parents took him to visit a family in an outlying homestead. Unknown to them Mau Mau guerrillas had raided the place killing everybody, even the animals. They tended to the dead and returned home where his mother lit the family diva (a small butter-lamp). Mansukha fell asleep, but remembered waking several times and seeing his mother tending the flame and praying silently. He never forgot the soft golden flame flickering in the dark as a soothing mantle of peace settled over him. Mansukha's mother told him that 'whenever you are tired, ill or overcome with sadness, light a flame. It will bring healing to your soul and peace to your mind.' From this came the group's resolve to have flames lit in each continent and brought back to the UK where they would be united to become the World Peace Flame on 31st July. Seeing as this was decided in April they didn't have long to make it happen! On 31st July, with the help of air forces across the continents, flames arrived in North Wales from Europe, Africa, America, Canada, Australia, India and The Middle East. The African Flame was lit in the house in Kenya where Mansukha had lived as a child and the flame from India was lit from the eternal flame at the Gandhi Memorial in Delhi.

All the flames were transferred to Olympic style torches and taken into the Conference Hall at Bangor University where more than six hundred people witnessed the coming together of the flames. The World Peace Flame had been born. Since then the flame has been presented to many people and places including the Pope, Westminster Abbey and The Houses of Parliament and burns somewhere in every country of the world. What a truly inspirational project – thank you Joan for enlightening us!

Open the Book

As most of you know a team from across our three churches take ‘Open the Book’ into Woodsetton School and Cotwallend School every month. This is an excellent way of spreading the word of God to children, and is very well received. There are ‘Open the Book’ teams throughout the country but I thought you would be interested to know about a pilot scheme in Ghana.

Bringing the Bible to life in Ghana

Just five months into Open the Book’s pilot in Ghana, things are going very well, according to Charles Twumasi, from the Bible Society there. The project is running in nine primary schools within the James Town and Mamprobi Communities, and Cape Coast in the Central region. Most of the schools approached have endorsed the programme and are ‘very excited’ about it, said Charles. Micheal Acquah, aged 10, said,

‘The Bible comes alive and it’s more practical than just reading.’

Michelle Yeboah, aged 7, added, ‘I like the Open the Book programme because it makes me know more about God’s word.’

Our advantage is that most of the schools are established in collaboration with churches and so there’s no rigid rule in discussing the Bible with the students. ‘Most of the 47 volunteers are young and eager to make their impact with the children. Many are aged between 18 and 24 years old, with a few of them being retirees but active in Church.’

She continued "Then how can I get into heaven?"

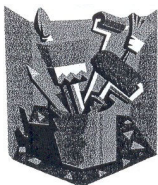

GERMAN APPLE CAKE

By Carol Brady (Pat Taylors Daughter)

German cuisine includes a wide range of cakes and tarts, which are often made with fresh fruits, like strawberries, plums, cherries and apples, of course. Those in the know, who have access to Bramleys, choose them.

Preparation time: 20 minutes

Cooking time: 1 hour 30 minutes

Serves 12

175g/6oz unsalted butter

175g/6oz caster sugar

675g/1½ lb Bramley apples, cored and sliced (You can substitute rhubarb or other fruit if you don't have apples)

3 large eggs, beaten

200g/7oz plain flour

2 tsp baking powder

150g pot soured cream

Topping:

50g/2oz unsalted butter

50g/2oz soft brown sugar

1 tsp ground cinnamon

75g/3oz plain flour

50g/2oz toasted flaked almonds (or ground almonds_

This moist cake is brimming with apple fruitiness all topped off with a crisp almond crumble topping. It's more of a dessert than a teatime bake - serve it warm with cream.

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/ 350°F/Gas Mark 4. Lightly oil and

line a 20cm spring form tin with baking parchment. Melt 25g of the butter and sugar together in a large frying pan. Add the Bramley apple slices and sauté for 3-4 minutes or until the apples are tender. Leave to cool

2. Make the crumble topping, melt the butter and stir in remaining ingredients

3. Cream the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy then gradually add the eggs, beating well between additions. Sift over the flour and baking powder then gently fold into the mixture with the soured cream

4. Spoon two thirds of the cake mixture over the base of the tin, scatter over a third of the crumble mixture and top with the remaining cake mixture. Finally, scatter over the Bramley apples and remaining crumble mixture. Bake for 1 hour 15 minutes. Cool in the tin for 10 minutes before transferring to a plate. Serve warm in wedges with more sour cream if desired

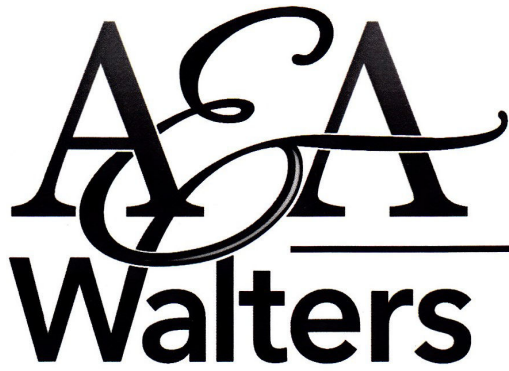
