2 June 1915 Transferred to East Yorkshire Regiment.

4 August 1915 sent to France.

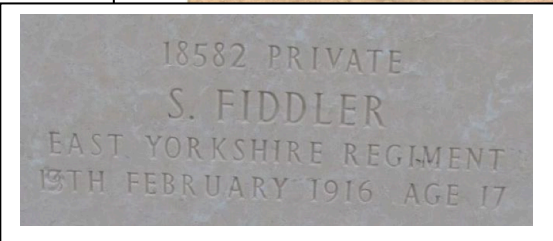
12 February 1916 Wounded in Action.

13 February 1916 died from a gunshot wound to the head.
